Information for Families

School Student Broadband Initiative

What is this initiative?

The School Student Broadband Initiative offers eligible households with school-age students free internet at home until 31 December 2025.

Led by the National Broadband network (NBN), the Australian Government initiative seeks to boost educational opportunities and narrow the digital divide.

To support eligible students to take part, schools have been given the names of students whose household may possibly be eligible.

How will families know?

We will send this communication home to eligible families via Class Dojo early next week.

Next steps for eligible families

After receiving the letter from our school, families and carers can choose to contact the NBN's National Referral Centre for an eligibility assessment.

If homes are deemed eligible, families will receive a voucher from NBN to use by 31st December 2024 to access free internet at home until 31st December 2025.

Information for Families

Save \$400

on school uniforms, textbooks and activities

\$400 School Saving Bonus for Families

Great news that the School Saving Bonus that has been mentioned throughout the media and previously in a school newsletter, will be distributed to schools after the 18th of November 2024.

Once funds are available at our school, parents and carers will receive an email directly from the Department of Education with their \$400 School Saving Bonus - remembering that this is a once-off payment for the support of families and students.

Accessing the \$400 School Saving Bonus

Parents and Carers do not need to apply for the School Saving Bonus.

The Department of Education will email parents and carer in November 2024 with your \$400 School Saving Bonus. You will be able to access it via an online system.

Our school is contacting parents and carers to ensure we have your email address on file - if you have an updated email address from the start of your child's enrolment, please contact our school so we can update our file.

What can the \$400 Bonus be spent on?

Parents and Carers decide how to best use the School Saving Bonus for your family's needs. You can choose how to allocate the \$400 in the online system.

The bonus can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

- book list and school items for 2025
- camps, excursions and incursions
- swimming and sporting events
- School uniforms, graduation events.

The bonus can be used at our school's textbook or

uniform suppliers either in-store or online. The list of suppliers may include a school uniform or bookshop. Any amount that you choose to allocate to textbooks and uniforms will be valid until 30 June 2025. It will then transfer to your child's school account for future activities.

Funds will roll over for use in future years if it is not all spent in 2025.

More than one Child?

Families who have more than one child at the same school can combine their School Saving Bonus payments to use on one child, or for a specific activity. So, for example, a family with 3 children who are all government school students would receive support to the value of \$1,200 and choose how they spend those funds.

The School Saving Bonus cannot be combined across different schools.

We are again appealing to all families to continue to encourage your children to attend school every day and on TIME.

Thank you for arriving at school on time!

Arriving late to school interrupts the learning and teaching for everyone.

Lost school days build up one absence at a time and impact learning and friendships.

ROUTINES can assist families to be on time. Simple things that children can do the night before school can help with that early morning rush.

- Put their bag at the front door before they go to bed
- Have clothes ready on the end of their bed or on a chair the night before
- Prepare notices/canteen money etc in a handy pouch or envelope and place in school bag
- Have a regular place in the kitchen for to collect lunchbox es/drink bottles before leaving
- Set a timer in the morning with intervals to keep track of time

We need to ensure that we are teaching children about the importance of school routines not just for now but for future schooling and beyond.

The impact of arriving late to school is that they miss out on valuable instruction at the commencement of each lesson and sometimes miss out on entire lessons and introductions to new skills being taught.

Our aim at Frankston Primary School is for our students to recognise and value being at school and the importance of punctuality.

Let's continue to work together to support your child's attendance goal whether that is to maintain their current attendance level or improve their attendance percentage and then we will all celebrate this together.

FPS 18.7% Average Absences


SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Why is it important to continue to improve our student absence?

Our absence data has shown us that the work you are doing along with us to ensure that your child is attending school really is making a difference and assisting us to maintain significant improvement in our school's attendance rates. Right now though our data shows us that our current percentage of absences is now beginning to increase in comparison with last year. I would like to reiterate that the importance of reducing absence rates is NOT about the DATA but about your child's learning. The DATA simply gives us a picture of how we are comparing to previous years and other similar schools.

I encourage everyone to maintain your focus on the importance of your child being at school EVERYDAY and remember the implications of frequent absences when deciding whether or not your child stays home when they are actually NOT sick.

If you look at this table below it gives you a breakdown of Frankston Primary School's student absences.



9% of our students (26 students) have zero absences

49% of our students (134 students) have between .5 and 9.5 days absence 26% of our students (72 students) have between 10 and 19.5 days absence

7% of our students (18 students) have between 20 and 29.5 days absence 9% of our students (24 students) have over 30 days absence ranging to 73days absence

As a school our job is to identify our students and track those students who have increasing absences and the explanations provided for their absence.

What concerns us is the large number of absences across all of our data that are unexplained. Unexplained absence means that despite the school's daily SMS asking parents to provide an explanation for their child's absence the school continues to have large numbers of unexplained absences.


Please ensure that you inform the school when your child is absent from school and the reason for their absence.

Let's continue to work together to reduce unnecessary absences and see our students engaged in the learning opportunities available to them at FPS.

Dear parents and carers,

In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers

Before 18 October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

Complete enrolment: If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025.

Check your contact information: Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us. You can check this information by contacting us directly.

We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the

Department of Education will email you twice:

in October, to verify your email address

in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus information.


