# WELLBEING

# R U OK? STARTING CONVERSATIONS

Conversations have the power to change lives helping to create supportive communities where we can talk openly and feel empowered to seek help when we need it, is something we all should strive to do.

Here are some top tips about starting conversations with your children:

Ask questions and listen—Asking questions can give them space to express how they're feeling and what they're going through, and it will help you to understand their experience better. Try to ask questions that are open and not leading or judgmental, like "how does that affect you?" or "what does it feel like?"

Think about the time and place—Sometimes it's easier to talk side by side rather than face to face. So, if you do talk in person, you might want to chat while you are doing something else. You could start a conversation when you're walking, cooking or stuck in traffic. However, don't let the search for the perfect place put you off and if they take the opportunity to go first, try to listen. Remember conversations for them are often extremely hard to start as they are not sure of what your reaction will be!

Treat them the same—When a child has a problem and they open up about their problem, they don't want to be treated any differently. If you want to support them, keep it simple. Don't try and fix it—When someone has a problem, they're still the same person as they were before. Do the things you'd normally do. Be patient.

Always remember no matter how hard you try, children might not be ready to talk about what they're going through. That's ok – the fact that you've tried to talk to them about it, may make it easier for them to open up at another time when they feel more comfortable to talk to you.

If you continue to suspect that something isn't quite right with your child then perhaps try getting another person that your child knows and trusts to attempt to start a conversation with them.

I am often amazed at how much children will tell us when they feel that it is ok to share something without judgement or fear of getting into trouble.

Our kids will make mistakes as they go through life and we do want them to be able to open up to us.

Keep trying to engage your children in conversations, often so much time is spent behind computer screens or texting which takes us away from the true art of those 'real' conversations.

There will be 2 assigned photographers to capture the performance on the night for school-based use of photos – and will follow all current parent consent usage.


#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

Dear parents and carers,

In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

### **Actions for parents and carers**

**Before** 18 October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

**Complete enrolment:** If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025.

Department of Education will email you twice:

in October, to verify your email address

in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus information.

As a Berry Street foster carer, you'll be a part of a team that is committed to supporting children who are unable to live with their family.


