# Social Media Safety - Information from the Department of Education

Parents and carers play an important role in supporting their children to be safe online and on social media.

You can help your children safely navigate their digital world and educate them to avoid harmful online experiences. You can explore websites, games, apps and social media together and set some rules and boundaries.

Your support and guidance can give your children the knowledge to make sound decisions online and confidence to ask for help when they need it. It is also important to stay informed about online safety.

The Department of Education recognises this important issue and has developed fact sheets about supports to help keep students safe online and what to do if they are involved in an online incident.

The fact sheets contain links to evidence-based information on supporting positive and safe online experiences, signs a child or young person might need support, what to do if something unsafe happens online, and where to reach out to for more support.

To access the fact sheets, refer to the <u>Safe Socials</u> <u>webpage</u>. The fact sheets are available in 19 community languages.

### PUBLIC CONSULTATION ON AGE LIMITS FOR SOCIAL MEDIA

The government is also launching public consultation on age limits for social media.

You and your children can share your experiences to inform proposed changes via an online survey, before 5 pm on Friday 1 November 2024.

# ARE YOU AWARE OF THE SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS YOUR CHILD IS USING?

Times have certainly changed and social media platforms will continue to evolve and grow and whilst these technologies can be great for sharing ideas and keeping in touch, parents need to be proactive in monitoring their children's use. Sadly whilst there are minimum ages noted by the social media giants, very little is done systemically to enforce them so it is up to parents to monitor this.

I have highlighted the most commonly used social media platforms that many of our students are aware of and some are actually accessing at home.

Hopefully it provides you with the information you need when deciding whether or not to allow your child to access these.

Children do talk about the social media platforms they use with other students and we want to encourage you to learn a little more about them before saying YES!

#### Instagram

Minimum age: 13 years

Users can snap, edit, and share photos and short videos. Privacy settings allow content to be private or public. The platform allows sharing and commenting. As long as the account is private, no one can view or comment on a post. Risks include sharing inappropriate content among friends and sharing location publicly by using the location tags

#### WhatsApp

Minimum age: 16 years

A widely popular messaging app, WhatsApp allows users to send text messages, audio messages, videos, and photos to one or many people with no message limits or fees. It limits access to only those people in your contact list. But people in a group chat who aren't on your contact list can communicate with you.

#### 3. Snapchat

Minimum age: 13 years

A popular photo-sharing app, Snapchat lets users share pictures and videos for a preset length of time. Content will self-destruct when that time runs out. But keep in mind, people can still take screenshots and save the content. It gives a false sense of permanent deletion. The Discover feature may allow kids to have access to inappropriate content.

#### 4. Twitter

Minimum age: 13 years

A microblogging site that has the option to keep 'tweets' private or public. It can help teens keep up with their friends and favourite celebrities. Even though Twitter has the option to delete a tweet, the posted content could have been copied or stored.

#### Facebook

Minimum age: 13 years

This widely used social media app lets users share pictures, videos, and comments. It also has an instant messaging feature. Facebook helps teens catch up with friends, family and events.

#### TikTok

TikTok can be safe for kids 13 years and older.

TikTok is intended for 13+ users according to the app's community guidelines. The app can be safe for teens with proper parental guidance. As you will note all the above sites have a minimum age of use. Children in primary school are deemed to be too young to be on these sites and whilst we cannot tell parents what to do in their own lives we can only advise parents in the strongest possible terms to reconsider their children's use of these platforms.

You can enable time limits and the content filter on your kid's phone and protect the settings with a passcode. Or you can download TikTok, create your own account, and use the Family Pairing feature to manage your kid's TikTok settings using your phone

### Please see below for some tips of where to start:

### 5 Tips for monitoring your child's social media

- Don't allow kids younger than 13 on Facebook.
- Check the privacy settings on your child's phone and apps.
- Use monitoring apps such as Net Nanny and WebWatcher to track your child's social media behaviour.
- Have a discussion.
- Stay educated.

#### How do I manage my child's Social Media?

- Decide which sites they can join. Monitoring may start before your child even has a social media account.
- Create an email account for your child. Many large providers for email allow children to have email addresses.
- Set up an account together.
- Turn on privacy settings.

In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

**Before** 18 October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

**Complete enrolment:** If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025.

Parents and carers of Victorian school-aged children will receive the one-off School Saving Bonus
