School Council 2024—2025

The final School Council meeting for our 2024 council is Tuesday 11th February, with our 2025 School Council's first meeting of the year being Tuesday 11th March.

School Councils play a key role in Victorian government schools. Frankston Primary School Council is made up of a parent body, staff representatives and a co-opted community member. Participating as a school council member is a rewarding and challenging experience.

School Council:

- is a focal point for decision making on governance school policies
- is the governing body at the school
- is a representative body at the school
- is a representative body with a membership reflecting the important partnership between students, teachers and parents
- is accountable to the local community.

School Council meets a minimum of eight times through the year and conducts an annual general meeting and annual reporting meeting in March.

This year we have these School Council parent positions vacant to fill:

- 6 two year tenure parent School Council positions.
- 1 one year tenure parent School Council position.

The first point of call is for nominations and then a possible election, if there are more nominations that positions vacant. Nominations open this Monday 3rd February - further information on the process and timeline will be sent out to parents on Monday by the school office via ClassDojo.

School Improvements

Buildings and Grounds Update

Providing and maintaining safe and high quality buildings and grounds for our students remains an important focus for us as a school, with a number of projects completed over the holiday period.

Completed works include:

- Gutter and downpipe cleaning
- Oval and basketball court maintenance
- Mowing and tidying of sensory garden
- New softfall to both playground equipment areas
- Thorough school clean, including refreshed student toilets
- New yellow line guide markings
- Fresh seat painting in areas of the school.

School Saving Bonus Reminder and Support

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus (SSB) - a one-off support of \$400 for eligible government students from Prep—Year 12 in 2025.

Most families should have now received their SSB codes and have started to take advantage of this government support.


If you have only recently completed your enrolment into the Victorian Government school system, you can expect to receive your SSB code/s in the coming weeks.

If you have transferred to our school from another Victorian government school, any remaining funds on your SSB code(s) will soon be available to use at our approved school suppliers. We request your patience as this change is processed through the system.

The Department of Education has established a dedicated contact centre to support the SSB. The contact centre can be reached by either completing the School Saving Bonus enquiry form, or calling 1800 338 663, between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm on weekdays.
