#### **NAPLAN 2025**

NAPLAN (National Assessment Program) is a national assessment that students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year that assess student's progress through their school years.

Students complete NAPLAN testing online (apart from Year 3 Writing which is completed in paper NAPLAN booklets).

#### When does NAPLAN take place?

The NAPLAN testing period has been moved forward this year, with the testing window takes place from Wed 12 March and finishes on Monday 24 March.

#### How are NAPLAN results used?

- Parents and Carers may use individual results to discuss your child's learning progress with their class teacher
- Teachers use the testing results to help identify students who require further classroom learning challenge or extra support
- Schools use results to identify strengths and areas for improvement in the teaching of literacy and numeracy.

## <u>Parents/Carers can support your child in this</u> time:

- Ensuring your child is getting to bed early so they have good sleep ready for the next day
- Develop smooth morning routines so children are at school on time and prepared for the day
- Talk to your child about the testing time encourage them to not worry about the test and just simply to do their best, and that their best is great!
- Don't hesitate to talk to your child's teacher if you have any questions in regards to your child's participation.

Our students should all be extremely proud of their efforts. Well done to our Frankston Primary School swimming superstars!




