Building Indigenous Perspectives Across our School

Our school will be venturing into new focus areas as we build links with Indigenous perspectives further across our school.

Some focus areas next term include:

- Building First Nation's perspectives within our curriculum - staff professional learning in making further purposeful links within our learning program
- Koorie Kids Club - termly connections advocating Koorie student voice

We look forward to sharing these areas further during Term Two.

Student Wellbeing

Our school fosters a positive relational school culture through building positive relationships and seeking to repair and restore relationships. Our school takes a restorative approach to resolving conflict and preventing harm and is our fundamental platform for developing positive classroom climates, building positive relationships, maximising student engagement, resolving conflict and addressing bullying.

Through the use of a whole school Restorative Practice approach, relationships that have been damaged including through bullying, are restored through conferencing, reflection, acceptance of responsibility, self-regulation of behaviour, restorative action and consequence and forgiveness. This approach promotes school-wide health relationships and contributes to the improvement of learning outcomes.

Violence, bullying, and other offensive and harmful behaviours such as racism, harassment and discrimination will not be tolerated and will be managed in accordance with this policy and our [Bullying Prevention Policy](#). School's practice is also informed by the [Inclusion and Diversity Policy](#), [Student Engagement and Wellbeing Policy](#), [Student Management Policy and Procedures Policy](#).

When a student acts in breach of the behaviour standards of our school community, Frankston Primary School will follow a positive Restorative Practice approach throughout all process steps of a staged response, and remain consistent with the Department's policies on behaviour, discipline and student wellbeing and engagement.

Where appropriate, parents will be informed about the inappropriate behaviour and any restorative action follow up or possible disciplinary action taken by teachers and other school staff.

Our school considers, explores and implements positive restorative actions and interventions to support positive student behaviour before considering further measures such as withdrawal from the yard or class.

Disciplinary measures may be used as part of a staged response to inappropriate behaviour in combination with other engagement and support strategies to ensure that factors that may have contributed to the student's behaviour are identified and addressed.

Disciplinary measures at our school will be applied fairly and consistently. Students will always be provided with an opportunity to be heard.



Student Behavioural Expectations and Management

Disciplinary measures that may be applied include:

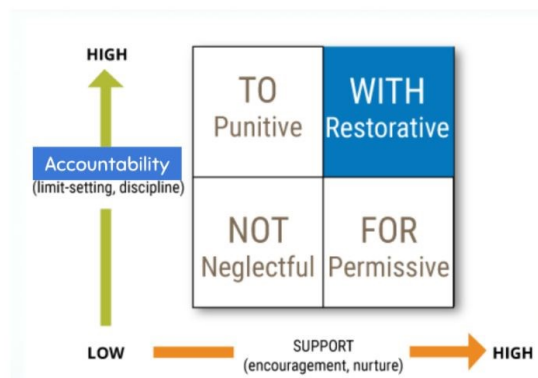
- A restorative conversation with a student that their behaviour is inappropriate and possible follow up restorative actions to 'fix the harm'
- Follow up restorative actions such as teacher controlled consequences such as moving a student in a classroom or other reasonable and proportionate responses to misbehaviour
- A restorative behaviour contract outlining possible withdrawal of privileges of breach of agreed contract
- Referral to the Assistant Principal / Principal
- Behaviour support and intervention meetings
- Consequences implemented through school actions e.g. removal from classroom or yard.
- Other relevant Education Department actions.

How we work with ALL children at Frankston PS

We work and support all children through a restorative lens first - we work 'WITH' children.

Supporting all children in the development of their social and emotional thinking and feelings - this looks different for all children. We understand where children come from, and work with each child in supporting them in moving positively forward.

We don't give up - we continue to work in partnership with parents and carers in providing the care, understanding and support to each individual child - because every child deserves it.

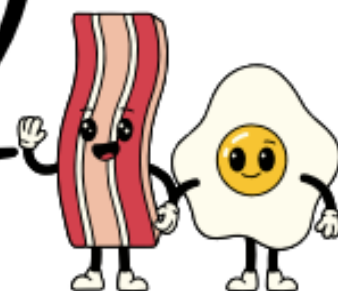

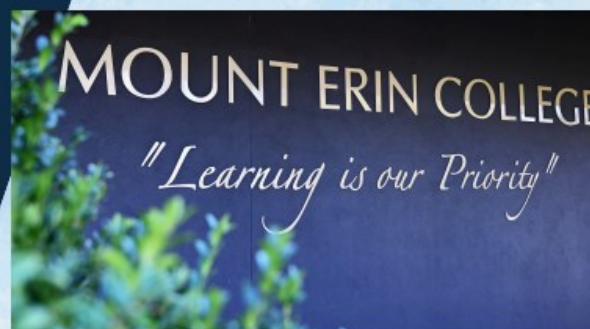
