Principal's Report

On Tuesday the Victorian budget was released, with the 2025/26 Budget investing **\$2.9 billion** in programs and supports to continue to make a difference to school communities and Victorian schools.

Budget support for schools includes a focus on:

- supporting families with the cost of living
- evidence-based excellence in teaching and learning
- promoting equal access to education
- strengthening student engagement and achievement
- more support for schools and school staff
- new school builds for developing areas

This budget supports the easing of cost-of-living pressures for families in schools through the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund, with an increase from \$154 a year to \$400 for eligible primary school students.

Unfortunately as we new, the School Saving Bonus is only available for the 2025 school year, yet unspent funds are rolled-over to next year for families to spend.

Principal's Report

Student School Attendance

every-day, is vitally important - school attendance of school can look like - it doesn't seem like much at matters for each and every child, of all ages.

On-time Attendance

On-time attendance is students being at line up at the start of the day just before the first morning bell.

On-time attendance at Frankston PS is:

8.50am - morning bell.

On time attendance ensures your child is a part of the early morning routine of settling into the school day.

Every-day Attendance

Every-day attendance is students being at school every day, apart from when they are sick, or have the occasional specialist appointment which can be very challenging to schedule in out-of-school hour times every time.

Students who are not at school everyday, present with gaps in their learning; they miss out on important lesson sequencing and can struggle to attain their academic and learning potential.

They can experience more social disconnection and can struggle with maintaining positive friendships. They are more likely to feel disconnect with teachers and their peers - and this leads to further disengagement.

The Educational Impact of Low Attendance

- Missing one day per fortnight is the same as missing 4 weeks per year
- Missing one day per fortnight for all of primary school - is the same as missing 7 months of schooling.
- Missing one day per fortnight for all primary and secondary school - is the same as missing over a year of schooling.

Missing School One Day a Fortnight

The need for all children to be at school, on-time and This is a diagram of what missing one day a fortnight the time to take a day 'here and there', but the days absent add up and can greatly impact negatively on a child's schooling and education.



We understand that there are times when a child may need to miss school, but a reminder to think about keeping family holidays and appointments to outside school time where possible.

If your child is worried about something at school, bring them to school and reach out to their class teacher or our wellbeing support so we can help sort out any troubles or worries they may have. Avoiding school can often make a situation feel worse and build further negative feelings.

We are only a phone call, Class Dojo message or touch-base away to help support your child.

We know that parenting is challenging and parents juggle many balls in the air at once - if you are having some troubles, reach out and touch base with us to see how we can work together in supporting your child in their on-time and regular attendance.

Wear it Yellow Day


Wear it Yellow
