# <u>Principal's Report</u>

#### **Indigenous Perspectives within our Learning**

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures are the oldest, continuous cultures in the world, having existed in Australia for at least 50,000 years.

The uniqueness of these cultures and the wisdom and knowledge embedded in them are things to be highly valued by all Victorians.

The Victorian Curriculum includes the knowledge and skills students are expected to develop about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders histories and cultures, given their particular and enduring importance.

All teachers must follow the relevant protocols when teaching Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures. The protocols provide guidelines about how to protect the integrity of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural expressions and enable all Victorian teachers and students to engage respectfully and feel connected to this identity.

Aboriginal perspectives within the Victorian Curriculum are woven within and across:

- Literacy and Mathematics
- Physical Education and the Arts
- Science, History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship, Design and Technology

#### **Recent Activities**

Bush Tucker Workshop - we were recently lucky to be selected as a local school for a group of students to participate in a bush tucker workshop which introduced students to types of flora around local Bunurong country, the features of the flora and how these can be incorporated into cooking for taste and wellbeing purposes.

All of our students were thoroughly engaged learning about this local Aboriginal cultural knowledge - and we were also very happy to be able to taste test!

#### Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

Frankston Primary School is a proud Respectful Relationships school. We teach our students the importance of 'respectful relationships' and how to foster and maintain these utilising the Respectful Relationships education, which is part of the Victorian Curriculum and delivered by all Victorian government schools.

# RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS




The Respectful Relationships initiative came out of the Royal Commission into family violence, with research telling us that providing respectful relationships education at school can lead to positive impacts on our students' academic outcomes, their mental health, classroom behaviour and relationships. It supports students to develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills needed for respectful relationships and helps to build respect and equality across the entire school community.

Our school uses the Department of Education's evidence-based teaching and learning resources to teach our students about Respectful Relationships from Foundation to Year 6. The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships resources have 8 topics that teach students about emotional literacy, personal and cultural strengths, resilience, problem-solving, stress-management, help-seeking, gender norms and stereotypes and positive gender relations.

This semester we have worked on Topics 1 and 2, Emotional Literacy and Personal and Cultural Strengths to help students learn how to recognise and manage emotions throughout the day, as well as identifying their own strength and that of their cultures. Some of the activities the students have engaged in include







• In Years 1 and 2, students recognised and drew different emotions. They used scenarios to discuss how they can be good friends, for example: "Kristin had a bad day. Her friends said, 'We don't like you.

Your hair looks funny. You can't play with us'. They role-played the scenario and discussed the feelings and emotions associated with them.



- In Years 3 and 4 the students delved deeper into emotions discussing more complex emotions and identifying how these might appear for them in different situations. For example how would they feel if they scored the winning goal at netball or how they would feel if their brother borrowed a toy and broke it. They also looked at everyday strengths such as being kind, fair, funny, brave, forgiving, curious to learn, generous and brave and discussed how much we use these strengths in their everyday life.
- The 5/6s learnt how emotions may be interpreted through body language. In small groups they role-played different emotions and guessed the emotion that matches the body language of the role player. They recognised the highs and lows of emotions, including positive, negative and mixed emotions and discussed when people may experience these types of emotions. We are excited to advise that we are currently reviewing our work in this area to include related work including our school values, and explicit focus on anti-bullying and anti-racism learning we look forward to sharing further information about this work with our community shortly.
