Principal's Report

Updates in DE Suspension & Expulsion Policy

Our school is committed to providing a safe, respectful and inclusive environment for all students and staff. You may be aware of recent changes announced to suspension and expulsion powers that will be available to Victorian Principals from **day one of Term 3 (Monday 21 July 2025)**.

We know that students' behaviour outside of school, particularly online, can sometimes impact the safety of students and staff at school.

In exceptional circumstances, Principals of Victorian government schools will be able to suspend or expel students for behaviour that occurs **outside of school grounds and/or hours including online**, if it poses a **significant danger to the safety and wellbeing of students or staff**.

These powers apply **only to serious incidents** where there is a clear and close connection to the school and the behaviour of a student outside of school unreasonably impacts the safety and wellbeing of students or staff at school, and their ability to learn or work. Please note:

- They do not apply to behaviours unrelated to the school or school community.

They only apply to behaviour which occurs **from Monday 21 July 2025 onwards**.

Suspension and expulsion will remain measures of last resort – our primary approach continues to **focus on proactive and positive behaviour support**, including working with you to teach students the behaviours we expect of them, in school and in life.

Thank you for your continued support as we work in partnership to educate and support our young people.

Principal's Report

New Student Wellbeing Information

The Royal Commission into Victoria's Mental Health system highlighted that primary schools provide opportunities to identify children with mental health and wellbeing challenges, who can then be referred for treatment, care, and support.

The department commenced this initiative in recognition of the important role schools play in supporting the mental health and wellbeing of children and young people.

The MHiPS initiative provides funding to employ a mental health and wellbeing leader (MHWL) in every government and low-fee non-government primary school in Victoria.

The initiative has been rolled out across Victoria between 2023 to 2026 – with our regional area commencing 2026.

Teachers are employed in a MHWL role (Mental Health & Wellbeing Leader) and work across the school to implement a whole-school approach to mental health and wellbeing for students, staff, and families based on a broad knowledge of the needs of the school community.

This includes:

- building the capacity of school staff, in particular classroom teachers, to identify and support students with mental health concerns in the classroom
- supporting the school to create clear referral pathways internally (within school) and externally (to community services) for students identified as requiring further assessment and intervention
- coordinating targeted mental health support for students by working with regional staff, school wellbeing and leadership teams, teachers, parents/carers, and external agencies.

The MHWL role focuses on mental health and wellbeing promotion, prevention and early intervention, rather than the implementation of clinical or allied health approaches.

MHWLs receive training from the Faculty of Education at the University of Melbourne, and professional development through continued learning communities.

This is very exciting for our school moving forward in this space supporting students and families, and we look forward to planning for the commencement of this role Term 1 2026!

Parent and Carers - Maintaining a Safe Environment for All

Respect for School Staff & Parents and Carers

Staff at Frankston Primary School, including our leadership team, teachers, education support staff, and our office staff are committed to providing a positive and supportive learning environment for all our students.

Our staff work professionally at all times, take their work very seriously and feel privileged to be able to play an important role in each child's education at our school.

Parents, carers and visitors to our school also have an important role to play in fostering a safe and inclusive environment for the entire school community.

Our school has a zero tolerance approach to any aggression, intimidation, threats or harassment of school staff, by any means (e.g. in person, by phone, by email, on social media etc).

Unacceptable behaviours include, but are not limited to:

- being violent or threatening violence of any kind, including physically intimidating behaviour such as aggressive hand gestures or invading another person's personal space
- speaking or behaving in a rude, aggressive or threatening way, either in person, via email, social media, or over the telephone
- sending demanding, rude, confronting or threatening letters, emails or text messages
- discriminatory or derogatory comments
- the use of social media or public forums to make inappropriate or threatening remarks about the school, staff or students.

At the Principal's discretion, unacceptable behaviour may be managed by:

- requesting that the parties attend a mediation or counselling sessions

- implementing specific communication protocols
- written warnings
- conditions of entry to school grounds or school activities
- exclusion from school grounds or attendance at school activities
- reports to Victoria Police or legal action.

Respectful Parent Interactions on School Site

Frankston Primary School acknowledges that the behaviour of parents and carers towards each other also has an impact on our school community and culture - parents and carers have a shared responsibility to create a positive school environment for the children and young people at our school.

As parents and carers, we will:

- model positive behaviour to our child
- communicate politely and respectfully with all members of the school community, in line with the Department's [Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy](#)
- support school staff to maintain a school learning environment for all - this includes on school site, at school events and outside the school gates
- treat all members of our school community with respect.

Feedback from two of the parents who attended the session included;

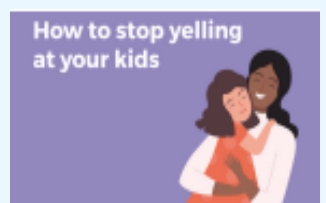
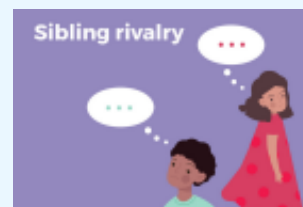
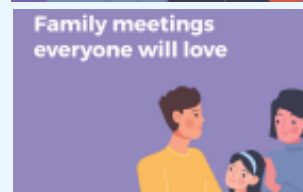
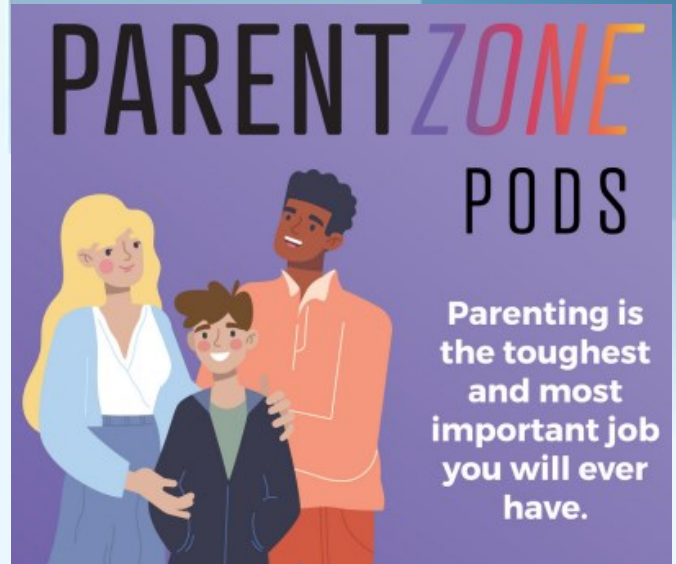

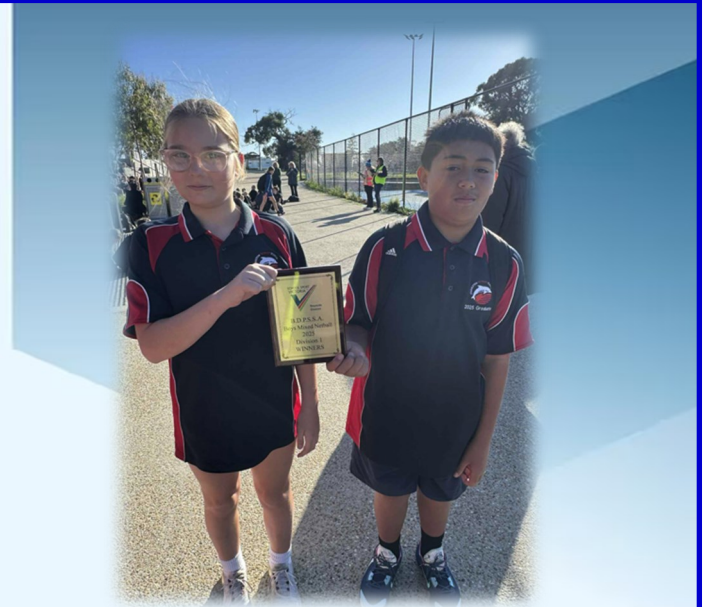


Netball

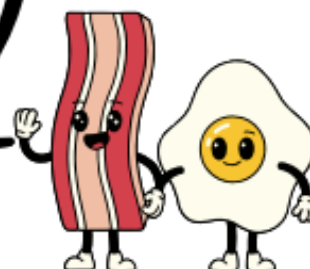

ONE STEP AT A TIME PROGRAM: PARENT SUPPORT FOR CHILDHOOD ANXIETY

Swinburne Psychology Clinic

Parents / guardians:

Do you have a primary school-aged child experiencing symptoms of anxiety?

Clinicians at Swinburne University have developed a program to help parents manage childhood anxiety in children aged 6-11 years.

Does your child experience any of the following?

- Difficulties sleeping at night due to worries
- Fears and phobias
- Difficulty separating from you or worrying about parental safety
- Trouble sleeping alone in their bed
- Fear of the dark
- Scared of lifts, trains, and people
- Fear of dogs and other animals
- Excessive worry and constant reassurance seeking
- Fear of germs and other health problems

The One Step at a Time Program involves:

- Comprehensive psychological assessment of your child's anxiety
- Seven sessions of online counselling through video conferencing
- Parent-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) skills to help you manage and support your child's anxiety
- Two combined parent-child sessions
- Reflective parenting strategies
- Access to a website with self-help materials to supplement therapy.

Cost

\$20 per session/assessment.
Treatment consists of seven therapy sessions plus one assessment session.
