School Attendance

This year our goal is for all students to **Strive to 95% Attendance**.

Each term, we will celebrate students who achieve 95% or higher attendance with a certificate presented to them in their classroom.

This term, we are delighted to congratulate 141 students who achieved 95%+ attendance for Term 1, 2026.

We also recognise students who have shown improvement in their attendance. This is measured by comparing attendance rates from the previous term to the current term. These students will also be acknowledged in their classrooms with a certificate.

We are proud to share our current average attendance rate. Congratulations to **Prep** and **Year 3** achieving above 95%. Our other cohorts are very close and will continue to **Strive to 95%**.

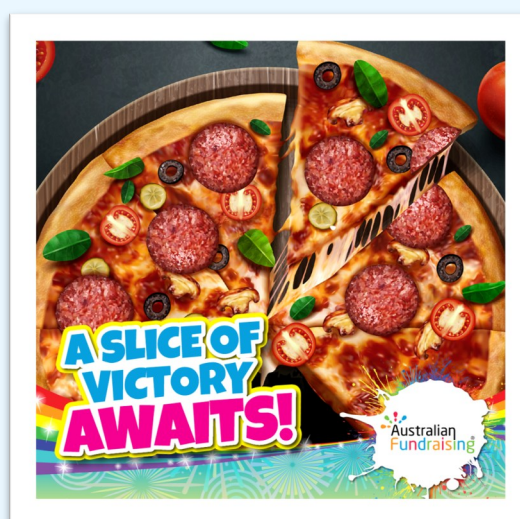
As the colour run will be run on the last day of term, we will be combining a “touch of Easter” with our colour run, so students are welcome to wear something Easter themed as we combine the celebration!

No. This is a free service for ALL students, provided by the Victorian Government.

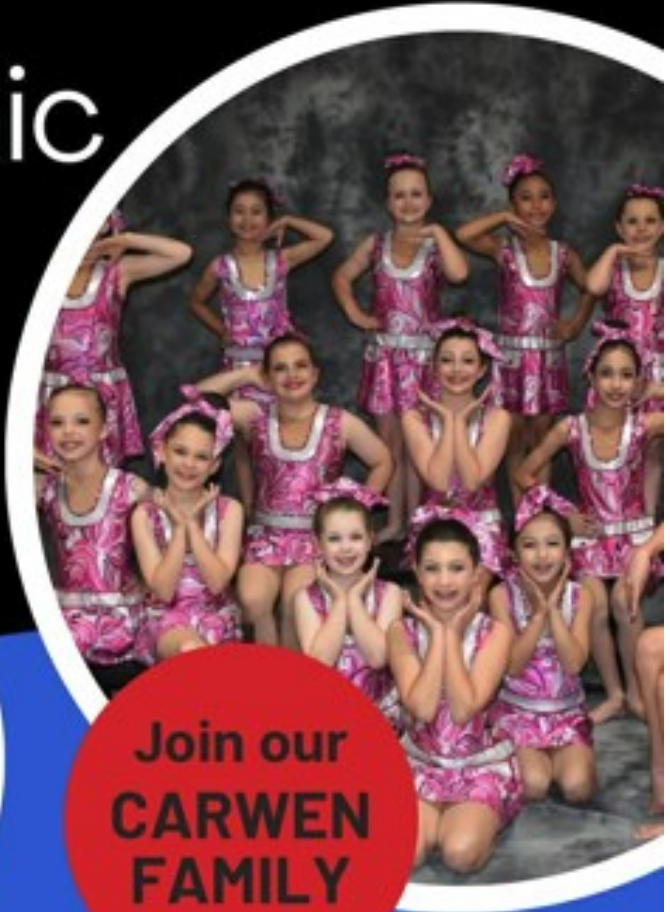

Frequently Asked Questions

Who is Dads Chat for?

If you're a dad, step-parent, grandfather or male carer who wants to build stronger bonds with your kids and give your kids the best shot at thriving, to feel more confident in your caring role, or simply connect with other dads on a similar journey- Dads Chat is for you.

When does it run?

The Dads Chat program runs from 22nd April 2026 to 13th May 2026, there are four sessions.

Where are the sessions held?

Sessions are held in person at Frankston North Community Centre, 26 Mahogany Avenue, Frankston North.

What will we actually do in the workshops?

Each session will start with hot food and will offer practical tools, real-life strategies, and open conversations around:

- Communicating with your kids (and keeping your cool)
- Dealing with emotions- yours and theirs
- Understanding the developing brain
- Parenting styles and how they impact connection
- Using play to build trust and resilience (even when time is short)

How much does it cost?

Nothing! Dads Chat is completely free to attend.

Do I need to attend all the sessions?

Yes, we encourage you to attend all four sessions to get the full benefit. Each week builds on the last, and being there consistently helps you connect more deeply with the content and the other dads.

Can I bring my kids?

This one's just for the grown-ups. We want to make sure you have the time and space to focus fully, connect with others, and take care of you. Because when you fill your cup, it's easier to pour into your kids.

What's Tony like?
