National Reconciliation Week

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia – with NRW commencing next week, Wed 27 May to Wed 3 June.



The theme for this year is ‘All In’ – and invites us to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation.

At Frankston Primary School our classes are participating in discussions about the importance and purpose of acknowledgements of country, and designing class-based acknowledgements, with these acknowledgements contributing towards a collaborative whole-school Acknowledgement of Country that will feature on a new handprint mural within our school. Students will also engage in class activities focused to deepen student understanding of reconciliation and the stolen generation, taking part in creating messages of reconciliation.

We look forward to celebrating our student’s learning, messages and work within our school community.

ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE AND STEM

At Frankston Primary School students learn about caring for our local environment and making positive choices for the future of the planet. Much of our learning takes place outdoors, with regular sessions held in the courtyard, sensory garden and our school food garden.



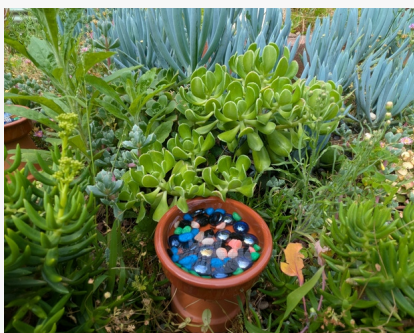
Students have the opportunity to explore sustainable gardening practices while growing a wide variety of crops throughout the year. The garden spaces are enhanced by colourful signs created using student artwork, giving students a sense of ownership and pride in our outdoor learning areas.

In addition to our food garden, we also have a beautiful succulent garden and vibrant flower beds complete with insect hotels and water dishes made by our students to attract pollinators and other beneficial insects.



Lunchtime Gardening Club

Our Lunchtime Gardening Club continues to be a popular activity for students who enjoy caring for the garden. Activities include harvesting seeds, planting into pots and garden beds, watering and weeding. These experiences help students develop practical gardening skills while learning about sustainability, responsibility and teamwork.





AUSLAN

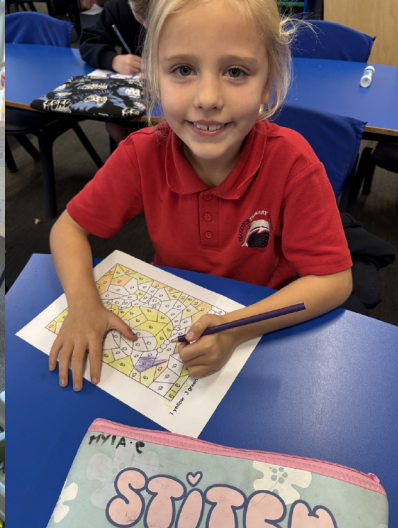
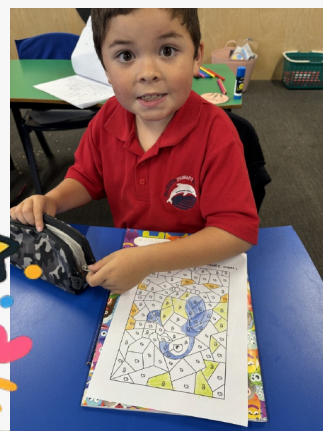
Here at Frankston Primary School, students learn Auslan as part of our Language for Learning program. Our students have been on this learning journey for the past three years and have developed valuable communication skills along the way.

Students can now confidently introduce themselves using basic greetings and share information about their likes and dislikes. This year, our focus has been on strengthening students' receptive skills and improving the speed and accuracy of their fingerspelling through a range of engaging games, challenges and interactive activities.

Throughout the year, students have also been exploring Deaf culture and learning about the Deaf community. They have been developing an understanding of the importance of visual communication by practising different attention signals, body positioning and appropriate interactions used in Auslan conversations.

Students are also looking forward to wrapping up the semester with a hands-on Auslan cooking challenge in a "voice-off" classroom experience. It is sure to be filled with excitement, teamwork and many valuable learning opportunities as students put their Auslan skills into practice in a fun and engaging way.

Students in Foundation to Year Two focus on developing their Fundamental Motor Skills through fun games, creative play, and movement-based activities. These early years are all about building confidence and coordination while introducing students to the basic skills and fundamentals used in a variety of sports.

From Years Three to Six, students participate in a wide range of games and activities that promote strategic thinking, teamwork, and game sense. These skills are explored through sports such as basketball, netball, soccer, rugby, and AFL, helping students develop their understanding of tactics, decision-making, and cooperation in competitive and non-competitive settings. Students will also learn about sports that are offered through Interschool Sport in the Bayside District. These sports include Athletics, Cross Country, Netball, Basketball, AFL9s, Soccer and more.

Across all year levels, there is a strong emphasis on sportsmanship, fair play, and respect. Students are encouraged to develop a positive mindset, celebrate effort and improvement, and support one another both on and off the field. We also place great importance on inclusion and ensuring every student feels valued and confident to participate. At Frankston Primary School, I believe everyone has the right to have a go and of course, have fun being physically active!

RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS



Frankston Primary School is a proud Respectful Relationships school.

Respectful Relationships Education is part of the Victorian Curriculum and delivered by all Victorian government schools. It supports students to develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills needed for respectful relationships, and helps to build respect and equality across the entire school community.

Research tells us that providing respectful relationships education at school can lead to positive impacts on students' academic outcomes, their mental health, classroom behaviour and relationships.

Our school uses the Department of Education's evidence-based teaching and learning resources to teach our students about Respectful Relationships from Foundation to Grade 6.

The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships resources have 8 topics that teach students about emotional literacy, personal and cultural strengths, resilience, problem-solving, stress-management, help-seeking, gender norms and stereotypes and positive gender relations.

This term in classes we are working on Topic 3: Positive Coping which supports students to develop language around coping, reflect on their coping strategies and build a range of positive coping strategies and Topic 4: Problem-Solving which helps students to learn a range of problem-solving techniques to manage personal, social and ethical dilemmas.

Topic 4: Problem Solving Foundation Level Activity example – 'The Picnic Problem Solving Game'
In this activity, students participate in a fun and interactive game where they work together to solve simple problems that might happen during a picnic. Through discussion, role play and shared thinking, students practise identifying problems, suggesting possible solutions and considering how others may feel in different situations.

The activity supports children to:

- Develop early problem-solving skills
- Practise taking turns and listening to others' ideas
- Learn respectful ways to solve disagreements or challenges
- Build empathy by thinking about others' feelings
- Strengthen communication and cooperation skills

This activity encourages students to understand that problems can be solved calmly and respectfully with the help of others.



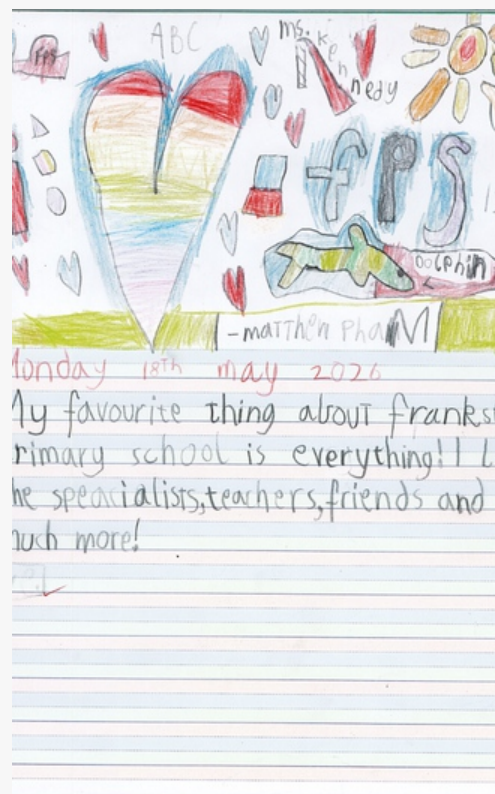
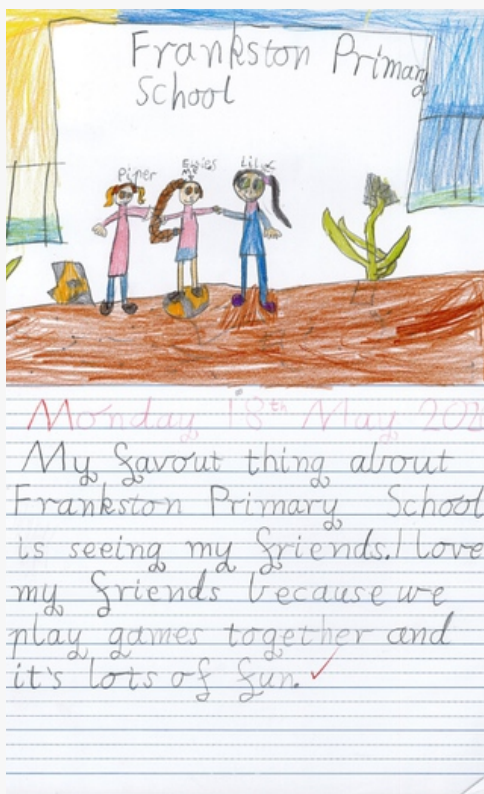
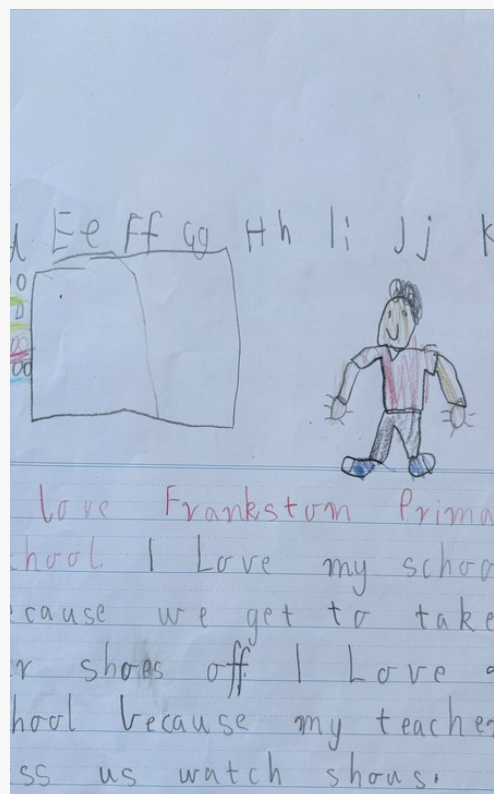
