Student Wellbeing

Year 5/6 Mental Health Workshop

We have been very lucky to have accessed a fully funded mental health workshop for our Year 5/6 cohort thanks to Speak & Share and the Sports Injury Clinic Frankston.

The Year 5 - 6 Primary School Program introduced students to the Speak & Share journey, focusing on building the foundations of emotional regulation in a fun, age-appropriate, and impactful way.

The focus of the workshop was to:

- Develop Emotional Literacy: Learning to recognise, name, and understand feelings.
- Explore Practical Strategies: Discover real-world ways to support mental health and wellbeing.
- Build Everyday Tools: Practise simple regulation techniques students can use at school, home and beyond.

A very special thank you to Speak & Share for the amazing workshop that supported the understanding of positive mental health for our young people, and to The Sports Injury Clinic Frankston for sponsoring the workshops.



Student Supports on School Site

NDIS Therapists

Our school welcomes and supports NDIS therapists, or other outside allied health workers to work with students on school site and see this work and these supports as a key part of student supports within our school. We work hard to try to fit in all supports within our school spaces, yet parents and carers should note that whilst we will always try to ensure we can accept all workers, this is also dependent on available space and school organisational demands.

Please find below some information for parents and carers who may be looking at the possibility of NDIS therapists to work with your child on school site during school hours.

WHAT:

Schools are governed by Education Department policy for how we process and approve NDIS support workers on school site, as well as the governing needs around accepting outside therapists on school site (such as parent consent, therapist information, OHS requirements, council leasing agreements)

PROCESS:

- The first step is contacting the Principal, this may come directly from the parent or carer, or from an outside therapist, and includes submitting a consent and therapist request form



PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

- Following this process, the Principal ascertains the ability to host an outside therapist onsite for those days, times and will approve or decline the request
- Following approval of request – following information is then sent to the therapist and company for completion, including a therapist sharing deed, OHS compliance information, and the signing of a school council lease (\$10 invoice to company for a 2-year lease)
- Once all of the above information is completed, the Principal will then confirm with all parties that the supports on site may commence.

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In Short – the Following Documentation is Required:

- Parent Consent Form – for each therapist
- Therapist Request Form
- OHS Compliance from the Company
- Therapist Information Sharing Deed
- School Council Lease - \$10 invoice to the company for a 2-year lease agreement.

Compass

As we near closer to term 3, we want to remind families that we are that we will be moving to Compass as our Student Management System from Term 3, 2026.

Compass Student Management System will be used to record student attendance, write student reports, and record an array of student data that the school houses such as family and student details.

Compass will also replace Class Dojo as our school's communication platform, with school news and chat functionality with your child's classroom teachers available through Compass too.

Compass also gives us a number of other exciting functions we will use as a school, including:

- Online Canteen Ordering
- Electronic excursion permission & payment
- Parent Payment processing & management

Over the next few weeks, our office will send out a range of information for parents and carers regarding the launch of Compass and how to use the platform. We will also host parent information sessions to support parents and carers in understanding how to use key items as well as answer any questions.

We're really excited for this update and look forward to sharing it with you!

Parent Payments

Parent and carer contributions play a vital role in supporting the programs, resources and opportunities available to our students.

These contributions help our school to:

- Maintain and improve our school grounds and facilities, including the employment of a grounds maintenance person.
- Provide and update laptops and iPads for student use, including our 1:1 laptop program in Years 5 and 6.
- Purchase new sports equipment.
- Expand and refresh literacy resources and mathematics equipment.
- Support student wellbeing through the purchase of resources that promote positive emotional and social development.

Information regarding the 2026 Parent Payment arrangements was distributed last year, and is available on our website or via the school office.

We understand that every family's circumstances are different and welcome confidential discussions regarding alternative payment arrangements or payment plans. Families requiring support are encouraged to contact the school office.

Thank you for your continued support of Frankston Primary School. Your contributions make a significant difference to the educational experiences and opportunities we are able to provide for our students.

Camp, Sport and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

Applications for the 2026 Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will close on **July 4th, 2026**.

The Camps, Sport and Excursions Fund (CSEF) is available to families holding a valid means tested concession and/or health care card. The CSEF payments are paid directly to the school and made available to families to spend on camps, sports, excursions and in-visits. The CSEF payment cannot be used towards uniforms or other expenses unrelated to the above listed items.

From 2026, eligible families will see an increase in support from \$154 to \$400 per student. Families with more than one child at the same school can combine (or pool) their CSEF to use on one child or for a specific activity (for example, a camp).

If you believe you are eligible, or you are unsure and want to check, please contact the school office for an application form (both digital and hard copy available) or a chat about your eligibility.

If you have previously been a recipient of the CSEF, you do not need to submit a new application unless your circumstances have changed (ie, a new sibling has commenced at the school, you've had a change of name or CRN).

PROTECTING AGAINST MOSQUITO-BORNE DISEASES

Some areas in regional northern Victoria are experiencing a longer mosquito season this year due to recent flooding. While the overall risk is currently low, some mosquitoes may be carrying diseases that make people sick.

The best protection against mosquito-borne illness is to avoid mosquito bites. The free Japanese encephalitis vaccine is also available for more Victorians.

Free Japanese encephalitis vaccines

Japanese encephalitis virus is spread to humans through bites from infected mosquitoes. It can cause a rare but potentially serious infection of the brain.

The free Japanese encephalitis vaccine is available for:

- people aged 2 months or older who live or work in eligible high-risk local government areas in Victoria
- until Friday 31 July 2026, people who plan to visit high-risk areas in Victoria or interstate for outdoor recreation such as hiking, camping, caravanning or boating.

- speak to your GP or immunisation provider to check if your family is eligible for a free vaccine ahead of any planned travel during the coming months.

How to help prevent mosquito bites

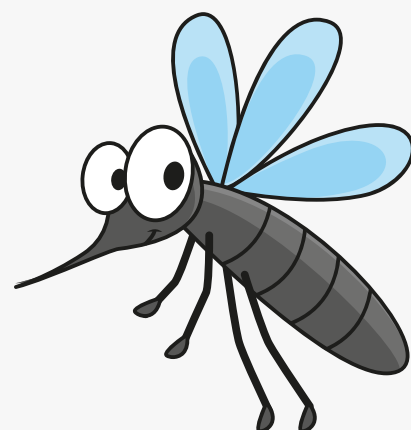
To help protect against mosquito bites, families can:

- cover up as much as possible with long, loose-fitting, light-coloured clothing
- apply insect repellent that contains picaridin or DEET on exposed skin when outdoors
- limit outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are active
- clean up and remove containers and items around the home that may hold water where mosquitoes may breed.
- Families with any health concerns should see their doctor or phone Nurse-on-Call: 1300 606 024 (available 24 hours).

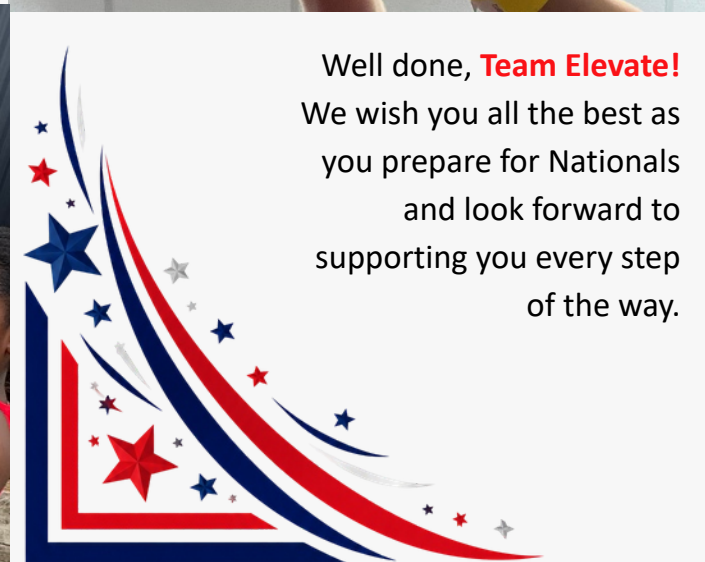




AREOBICS

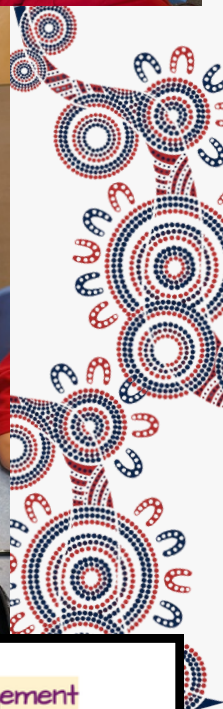
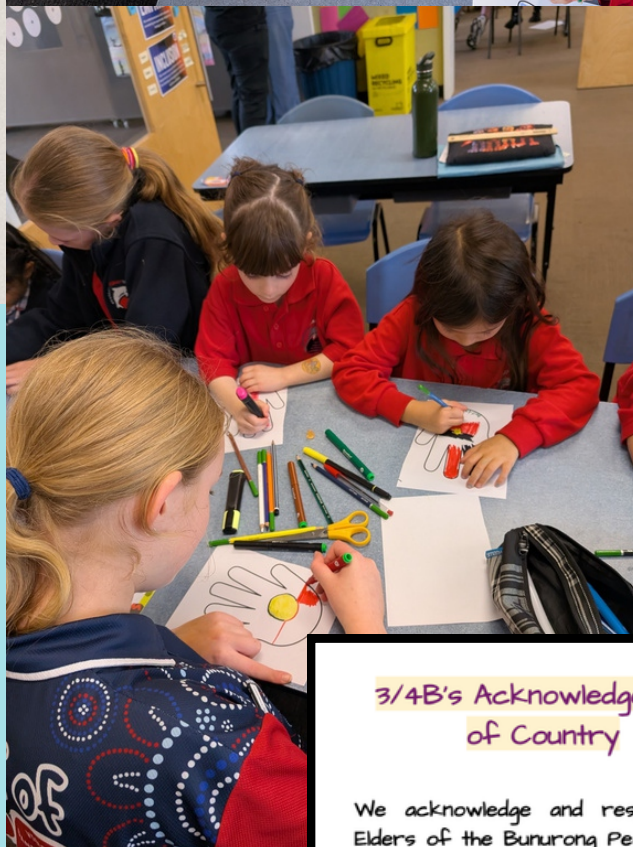


Frankston Primary School acknowledges the Bunurong people of the Kulin nation. We thank them for sharing this beautiful land with us, on which we learn, play, run and climb.
