NAIDOC Week

This week at school we are shining the light on our First Nations cultures and histories and students will participate in learning activities focused on the oldest, continuous living cultures on earth.

At Frankston PS we like to recognise National NAIDOC Week in our last week of Term 2, as this week of celebrations occurs during our school holidays.

The theme for NAIDOC Week 2026 is '50 Years of Deadly'.

• **"Deadly" Excellence:** In Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities, the word "deadly" is a term of the highest praise. It means excellent, inspiring, strong, and worthy of celebration

• **Honouring the Movement:** It is a tribute to the Elders, advocates, artists, organizers, and communities who have carried the movement forward over the last half-century

• **Survival and Protest:** The theme acknowledges the strength it has taken for First Nations people to stand firm, refuse to be silenced, and ensure their voices are heard across health, education, media, and the arts

• **Looking to the Future:** It is a statement of continuity—celebrating who Indigenous communities are today and looking ahead to the next 50 years of a future led by community and grounded in culture.

As a part of our NAIDOC Week celebrations our students will participate in P – 2 and 3 – 6 learning activity rotations on Wed 24th June 11.30 – 1.15pm. To celebrate NAIDOC Week, we will be having activity rotations between 11:30am and 1:15pm. Each activity will be based around a different Dreamtime story, with students listening to and discussing different stories and the connection these stories hold for First Nations People. With a range of fun activities to complete based on each story.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Student Wellbeing

Child Safe Standards – Child Safety

At Frankston Primary School, we pride ourselves in ensuring a high-level of Child Safe Standards practice. Just recently our school completed our mandatory 4-year cycle review of our child safe practice and school standards, with our end report reflecting a strong attention to detail and commending our school's work demonstrating a strong commitment to ensuring safe child safety practice across our school.

Recently the Education Department released an update in supports for schools and community members in implementing child safe practice. These can be found on the new PROTECT website – with clear supports for schools in understanding and following the 4 critical actions to identify and respond to child abuse.

These supports assist schools in supporting children across 4 different levels of possible child abuse, including:

- Adult engaged in work with the education department
- Student to student
- Family member to student
- Community member to student.



Early Term 3, our students will see new posters within their classrooms and around our school, supporting our students with visual knowledge of staff within our school who they are able to talk to if they don't feel safe. These posters will support work within our school through our Respectful Relationships program in age-appropriate consent education.

For people within our community – if you ever have concerns regarding a child, the best people to raise these concerns with are our wellbeing leadership team members, Renée Kennedy (Principal), Caity Visser (Acting Assistant Principal), Michelle Polley (Disability and Inclusion Leader), Bec Wilson (Mental Health in Primary schools Leader).

General Information

Little Angler Fishing Kits

The Victorian Government is committed to increasing the number and diversity of people fishing and enjoying Victoria's local seafood, growing healthy and sustainable fisheries sectors and contributing to Victoria's social and economic prosperity. As a result, the Victorian Government distributed 95,000 Little Angler kits to Year 5 primary aged students in 2023/24, via the Victorian Fisheries Authority, as part of a \$1.5M election commitment, funded via the sale of Victorian recreational fishing licences, i.e. funded by recreational fishers. Year 5 students have been selected based on the Victorian Curriculum focus, movement and motor development, and safety considerations.

The aim of this election commitment was to continue to grow recreational fishing participation in Victoria, by actively encouraging primary school aged children to learn more about the art of fishing, marine life and the natural environment.



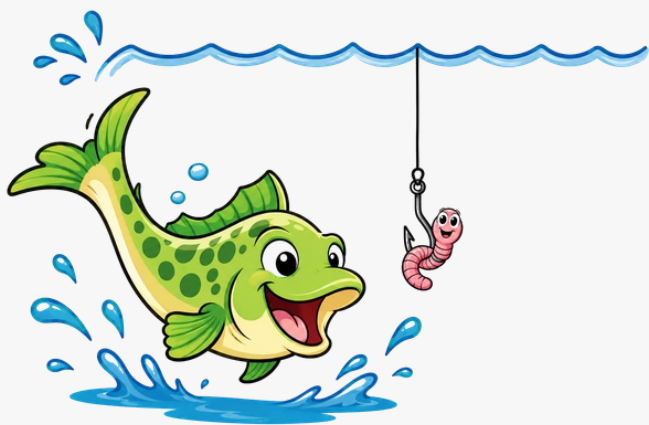
PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Following the successful implementation of the commitment, the Victorian Government is running the program again in 2026.

The FREE kits provide a wonderful school holiday activity for children with their families and help ease the cost of living, providing a fun activity close to home.

As a result, all our Year 5 students will receive a FREE Little Angler Kit.

Our school has opted to stay in the program so that parents can decide whether they want their child(ren) to receive a fishing kit.



Opt out

Parents of Year 5 students can advise our school closer to the time if you do not wish for your child to receive a fishing rod.

Receiving kits

The roll out of kits will occur in August 2026 so that all participating children will have a kit in time for the September school holidays.

The kits include:

- a rod
- reel with line
- tackle tray
- some tackle (including fishing hooks and lead-free sinkers)
- and information on how to use them to catch a fish.
- The kits will also have a safety label attached to the outside of the kit bag, recommending that students wait to open the kits until they are under the care and supervision of an adult.

Keeping Our Students Safe: Asthma and Allergy Management

The health and safety of our students is a top priority at Frankston Primary School. To ensure we can provide the best possible care in the event of an asthma or allergy-related emergency, it is essential that student health information remains current and accurate.

If your child has asthma, please ensure that an up-to-date Asthma Action Plan and in-date Ventolin medication are provided to the school office. Likewise, students at risk of anaphylaxis must have a current ASCIA Action Plan and an in-date EpiPen available at school at all times.

Having current medical plans and medication on site allows our staff to respond quickly and appropriately should an emergency occur. We ask all families to review their child's medical information and bring any updated plans and in-date medication to the office as soon as possible.

Thank you for helping us keep our students safe and well supported at school.

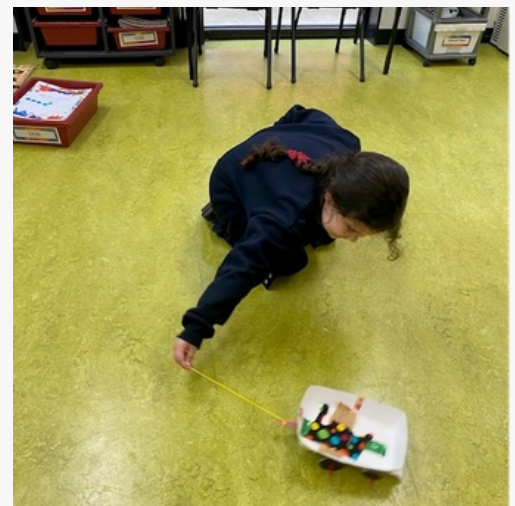
ART ROOM REPORT
